
COMMUNITY SERVICE & ACTIVISM

Because we can affect exponential change when we work together, we gather people of different backgrounds to serve the community side-by-side and coordinate public action to make a positive impact in the places we live.


NETWORK BUILDING

NOTRE DAME STUDENT TRIP TO BOSNIA & HERZEGOVINA

25 students came together in Bosnia & Herzegovina (BiH) to learn from Bosnian peacebuilders and social scientists about BiH's rich history of peacebuilding, competing ethno-religious narratives, trauma and cycles of conflict, and issues of identity. Ansari Institute Executive Director and Kroc Institute Faculty Fellow Dr. Mahan Mirza, Peace Catalyst International President Martin Brooks, and Sarajevo-based Peace Catalyst staff also led the students in guided reflections about how these topics are surfacing across Europe and the United States and how the students can reapply what they learned to their current studies and future work. **Read more**.

VENTURA COUNTY INTERFAITH FRIENDSHIP PROJECT

We hosted an initial interfaith dinner at a Catholic church in Ventura County, CA to help locals of diverse faiths connect across differences. Nearly half of the 125 people who participated then signed up for weekly Friendship Groups over the next month, and 34 individuals then attended a final celebration dinner at a local Islamic Center.

Participants were again offered the opportunity to form small groups, this time for the study of sacred texts, and as a result, 14 groups began meeting monthly for scripture study and service projects.

SCRIPTURALREASONING

Scriptural Reasoning is a practice where Christians, Jews, and Muslims study each other's sacred texts. Groups meet once a month to read short passages from their respective scriptures on a certain topic. Facilitated by a study leader, each session is an opportunity to listen and share various perspectives. The result is often a deeper understanding of others' and one's own scriptures, as well as the development of strong bonds across faith communities.

RESEDA, CA Local

Christians and Muslims from the
Hizmet Turkish community met
regularly for Scriptural Reasoning
and, as a result, have formed strong
partnerships and deepened mutual
understanding.

ONLINE AND WASHINGTON, DC we

partnered with Rumi Forum and Virginia
Theological Seminary to host monthly
Scriptural Reasoning sessions, each
hosted by a different facilitator and each
covering a unique scriptural topic.

UYGHUR ADVOCACY

At the close of the Beijing Winter Olympics, we hosted a listening event for people to hear about the plight of the Uyghurs from Uyghurs themselves. **Read more**.

As part of the peacemaking day at a their youth mission camp, 75 students at a Washington, DC church were encouraged to understand the Uyghur genocide within the larger context of peacemaking.

Multiple events were also hosted to educate the public about the fact that Uyghur children and others are being forcibly separated from their parents and placed in boarding schools where they are systematically stripped of their language, culture, and religion.

TRAININGSPOTLIGHTS

BOARDING SCHOOLS Government boarding schools similar to those built for North America's indigenous peoples are currently being used as a tool of genocide in China against Uyghurs and Tibetans, and we partnered with several human rights organizations to provide education about the situation.

CONNECTING IN CONFLICT We provided

a 6-session course to teach participants foundational skills for interpersonal conflict, including dialogue, mediation, and de-escalation.

NONVIOLENCE Drawing on

the principles of Kingian Nonviolence, we hosted a workshop to help people apply the principles of nonviolence to daily life, standing for what is right and good while having the compassion to see the dignity of those with whom they are in conflict.



YWAM TRAINING NORTHERN IRELAND

We had the privilege of speaking at the YWAM regional gathering in Enniskillen, Northern Ireland. Over the course of three days, we presented 1) an introduction to peacebuilding as God's mission and the Church's vocation, 2) workshop space to grapple with the complexity involved in peacebuilding, and 3) practical skills for interpersonal conflict and leading community peacebuilding efforts in divided societies.

CONNECTING IN COMMUNITY ONLINE

This online campaign was created to give people 10 small, easy things to do to start understanding themselves, their context, their community, and the conflicts in their settings. For each step, an explainer video was created and shared across our communications platforms. More than 240 people also participated in a Facebook group to engage with others, learn about these steps, and practice them together. **Watch the videos**.

RAMADAN FOOD PANTRY RESEDA

Our team in Reseda, California operates a weekly drive-up food pantry throughout the year to provide assistance to those facing food insecurity. During the month of Ramadan, thanks to grant funding from Islamic Relief USA, we were able to distribute an additional \$9,000 worth of staple food products as well as fresh food such as meat, fresh dairy items, and eggs.

AFGHAN REFUGEE RESPONSE BOISE

Boise is experiencing a housing crisis. The availability and affordability of low-Income housing is at an all time low, which has made it difficult for many new Afghan arrivals to meet their rent and utility payments. Thanks to a grant from Islamic Relief USA, we have been able to help families who were facing shortfalls in rent and utility obligations. We were also able to help families with cleaning kits, bathroom necessities, and kitchen supplies so that cash assistance from the resettlement agencies did not have to be used for these needs but could instead be reserved for needs such as school supplies, food, and medicine.

RAMADAN FOOD BOX DISTRIBUTION SEATTLE

During the month of Ramadan, we partnered with Islamic Relief USA to distribute food boxes to newly arrived Afghan families in need. Food boxes were delivered to our partners at the Islamic Community of Bosniaks, and 15 volunteers from the mosque and from the Seattle Afghan Association assisted in distribution. Each food box contained a sufficient amount of food for a family of five for two weeks and consisted of basic food staples such as flour, sugar, black tea, peanut butter, tuna, and pasta.
